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PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

East Asian Catalog Team Leader, February 1997- University of Oregon Libraries.

Manage the East Asian Cataloging Team and maintain an efficient team workflow to ensure cataloging quality and productivity. Directly supervise 1.25 FTE classified staff including one Chinese and one Japanese catalogers, and a temporary part-time Korean cataloger. Provide effective supervision and training for the members of the East Asian Catalog Team; provide timely feedback and conduct annual performance appraisals. Participate in departmental and library projects to meet evolving institutional priorities. Play an active role in the planning and implementation of objectives in bibliographic access and control for the Libraries.

Perform high-level original and complex copy cataloging of Chinese language materials including monographs, serials, maps and non-print formats such as electronic resources, videos and microfilms. Perform authority control, database maintenance tasks and resolve cataloging problems. Perform retrospective conversion of Chinese language materials and participate in the cataloging of University of Oregon theses and Special Collections materials. Participate in the national cooperative cataloging programs including NACO and BIBCO; create and review NACO headings of Chinese and Japanese personal names and series that are contributed to the national authority file. Provide assistance to other technical and public services units in the Libraries. Assist and provide consultation to library users and other libraries in the State.

Contribute to the advancement of the Libraries' mission and to the profession through service on local and national committees, publishing of journal articles and attendance at conferences. Serve as the UO Libraries' representative to the OCLC CJK Users Group.

Senior Chinese Cataloger, September 1995 – January 1997. Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Cataloging tasks — Performed original monograph cataloging of CJK and English language materials in all subject areas according to AACR2, LC Rule Interpretations and OCLC format and standards. Provided peer-review of original CJK cataloging records created by professional catalogers. Revised descriptive cataloging and complex copy cataloging records done by CJK copy catalogers, and assigned LC classification number and LC subject headings as needed. Performed authority work on all headings and series in cataloging

records. Resolved conflicts and correct problems related to CJK cataloging and performed database maintenance in the local online catalog.

Supervisory responsibilities — Assisted in formulating and updating cataloging policies and procedures. Assisted in monitoring the CJK Cataloging workflow and improving its efficiency. Provided supervision and on-going training for the copy catalogers. Coordinated thesis cataloging activities and other special projects. Conducted annual performance appraisals for copy catalogers. Shared the responsibility of compiling monthly statistics for the CJK Section.

Provided full-level original and copy cataloging of English language monographs and Chinese language materials in various formats, including monographs, serials, videotapes and microforms. Contributed name and series authority records to the national authority file through Name Authority Cooperative Project (NACO). Responsible for authority control related to Chinese materials in the local database.

Supervised and managed the East Asian Cataloging Team, which consisted of two copy catalogers (Chinese and Japanese) and two student assistants. Conducted annual performance appraisals. Taught classes of LC Classification and LC Subject Headings at the training workshops for copy catalogers. Selected, hired and trained student assistants to perform various tasks.

Served as Chinese resource specialist, helped library users find Chinese research materials, and retrieved vernacular journal articles for the Interlibrary Loan Department. Served on University and Library committees.
