A companion reading list to the lecture by David Orr and Cascadia.

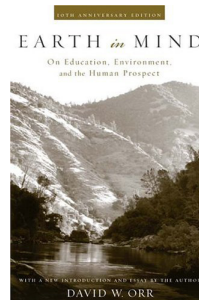

A little book that takes a long view on climate change.

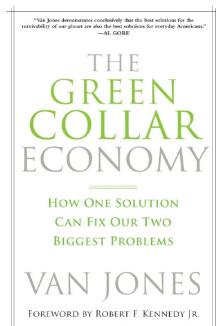

David Orr's meditations on the flaws in our educational system, and their effects on our place in the world.

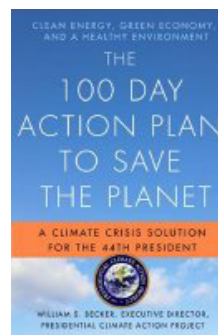

Human rights activist Van Jones's plan for building a fair, sustainable economy for the 21st century.

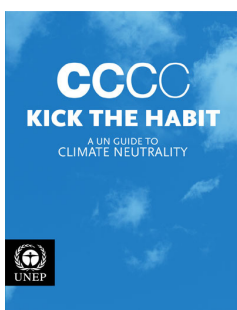

The Presidential Climate Action Plan offers climate-related recommendations to President Obama for his first 100 days in office.

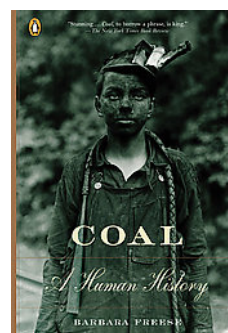
